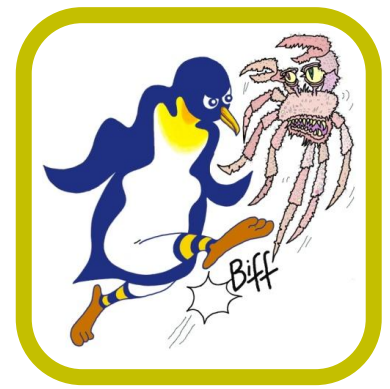

Dear Breast Cancer Now,

We are electronically transferring a Grant of £10,000 from Penguins Against Cancer (PAC) to you, to be used to fund your '**Creating a Robotic Assistant to help everyone access Breast Cancer Screening**' initiative. This is in addition to the £5,000 we sent you in February 2024, the £11,900 we sent to you in December 2019, the £2,000 we sent you in July 2017 and the £1,000 grant we sent to 'Breakthrough Breast Cancer' in May 2014.

This has been proposed by Jamie Dunbar and Pat Gush and is in direct support of Oriele Dunbar who we would like you to acknowledge as the inspiration behind this Grant. She has this to say: *'I am incredibly proud of my son, Jamie Dunbar, for taking on the Paris Marathon in support of his mum and such a meaningful cause. Having supported Breast Cancer Now for over 30 years, I gained a far deeper understanding of the realities of breast cancer when I was diagnosed myself in July 2025. Since then, I have undergone a lumpectomy, radiotherapy, and am now taking aromatase inhibitors as part of my ongoing treatment. A diagnosis affects so much more than many people realise, and it is only through personal experience that you truly appreciate its physical and emotional impact. When Breast Cancer Now introduced this research project, it opened my eyes to another important aspect of breast cancer care: the barriers faced by people with disabilities who maybe unable to access routine mammograms. Ensuring that everyone has equal access to screening and early diagnosis is vital, and I am delighted to support such an important and worthwhile piece of research.'*

This Grant was made possible through very successful fundraising of £4,185 by Jamie Dunbar who completed his first marathon at this year's Paris Marathon in a very creditable time of 03:43:12. He has this to say: *'PAC has played an instrumental part in my time at medical school and it feels fitting to end my studies by undertaking a personal fundraising challenge on its behalf. I am incredibly grateful to everyone who supported my marathon fundraising effort and I would particularly like to thank PAC for matching the funds raised and enabling a substantial contribution to a cause so close to my family's heart. I look forward to*

seeing the impact this research has and am already planning my next fundraising effort!'

PAC exists to raise cancer awareness, and to provide support to cancer research and treatment, as well as to hospices. It has no running or administrative expenses (all costs being met by individual PAC Members) and has many students studying at Guy's Hospital, of whom Jamie is one, as active supporters.
