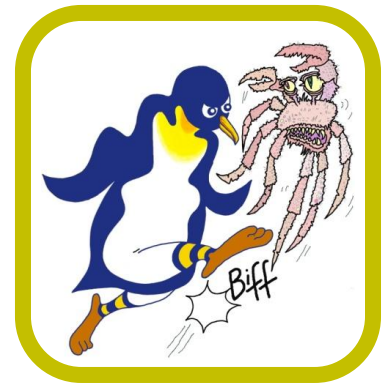

Further to our donation sent to you in January, I am pleased to enclose a cheque for £1,000 from Penguins Against Cancer, to be used to further research into treatments for Sarcoma.

Penguins Against Cancer is a small charity set up to raise awareness of cancer and to provide support to cancer research and treatment, and hospices.

This donation has been made possible following a fundraising dinner held on 4th October 2014, the proceeds of which have been targeted towards research and treatment of myeloma and sarcoma. The dinner was preceded by a closely-fought rugby match between the Penguins and a Guy's Hospital Freshers' XV, held to mark the retirement from the rugby field of Dr Terry Gibson, after 52 seasons of senior rugby.
